We share a wonderful but fragile planet which God gave into our care.

You can find out more about this in the Bible; read - Genesis chapter 1 - and note verse 28.

- We are destroying the planet by our actions and facing a major world crisis. Read the words of Jesus Christ; Revelation chapter 11 verses 18 and - Luke's Gospel chapter 21 verses 25–27
- But God has promised that He will not allow the earth He created to be destroyed - look at Isaiah chapter 45 verse 18, Genesis chapter 8 verse 22, and Matthew chapter 24 verses 21–22
- God will intervene to change the world by sending His Son Jesus Christ back to the earth to rule over it as His Kingdom. See Acts chapter 1 verses 6-11; Hebrews chapter 9 verse 28; and Isaiah chapter 2 verses 1–4
- This intervention will be a great upheaval, coming suddenly on a world largely neglectful of God's ways Read Matthew 24 verses 37–39

- God wants us to change our way of life to be fit for His new world. Jesus said people need to 'repent'. Check out 2 Peter chapter 3; Isaiah chapters 45 verses 22–23 and 55 verses 6–11
- We need to consider these things and act now!
- If you are not familiar with the Bible, use the index, usually just inside the cover, where all the books will be listed

What should we be doing about this?

- Think about our use of the earth's resources
 - Insulate our houses
 - Turn our heating down
 - Share transport
 - Reduce pollution
- Get out a Bible and read about what God the creator has planned for our world

The Christadelphians (the name means 'Brethren in Christ') model themselves on the first century believers. The beauty of early Christianity was its simplicity:

- They read the Bible daily
